



My lockdown garden project is to have a shed workshop in the garden.

I did have an unused greenhouse so I sold it just after Christmas and had the area brick paved.

delivered in May.

I ordered a 8 x 10 shed from Timberlux to be

The ground slopes so I decided to build the base myself to level it up



4 x 2 joists and decking boards and 3 @ 8 x 4 shuttering ply

I cut timber to length and notched the 4 x 2 to slot the decking boards



Then treated the timber with fence life.

Assembled the timber grid and levelled it up with a course of bricks and support legs

Squared the joists and laid the plywood and cut it to size then cut and fitted the trim around the sides







Painted the boards with 3 coats of floor paint, and now waiting for the shed

'FluBot' malware scam delivery message

Scam package delivery messages containing dangerous malware have been on the rise. This malware or FluBot contains a harmful link to download an app that can infect your phone, harvest passwords and personal info, as well as access your contacts. This is just one type of text message scam.

Ever received unexpected calls telling you that cover for your washing machine, oven, dishwasher or other home appliance cover is due for renewal?

Unfortunately, widespread cold calling and sharp sales tactics with fraudsters and firms masquerading as established brands surged in 2020, and we've been receiving an increase in reports of these types of cold callers.

Here's the lowdown on how they operate and how to deal with them.

Clamping down on cold calls

Fraud on PayPal

While PayPal has policies in place to help bring scammers to justice, it's often a target for fraudsters looking for quick access to customer's money and their tactics are becoming trickier to spot.


In this instance, PayPal misunderstood the tactic of remote access software increasingly being used to access its site, leading to it contradicting its buyer policy that says it will investigate fraud on its platform and that customers aren't liable for unauthorised purchases.









Boot Bench & Box

Plywood Layout Sketch #5


