

Monzo spoofing scam

Two good news stories we could all use.

Another victim had £8,000 wiped out of his account.

Monzo eventually reimbursed both individuals in full. We explain the <u>scammers' tactics</u>, why we helped and why banks have a responsibility to protect your money.

NatWest introduces new measures to beat scammers

To reduce the risk of fraud, NatWest Group customers can now set their own daily bank transfer limits. By giving customers more control it hopes to reduce authorised push payment (APP) scams - where victims are convinced to move money to an account controlled by a criminal.

We explain how this works and what other banks are doing to combat fraud.

How does this help tackle fraud?

Fake WhatsApp verification

Hackers are trying to obtain access to WhatsApp accounts after stealing the identities of their victims' contacts.

You'll receive an unexpected but genuine text message from WhatsApp containing a verification code. The text is triggered by fraudsters entering your number into WhatsApp in an attempt to log in to your account. Next, one of your 'contacts' will message you via the app to try and persuade you to give them the code you've just received.

Here's <u>how scammers have tricked people</u> into passing on the verification code and steps you can take to further protect your WhatsApp account.


