CALL 999 FIRE SERVICE

INFORM MUSEUM STAFF OF DANGER TO ANY LAMP ROOM OCCUPANTS

IF SAFE TO DO SO, TACKLE ONLY SMALL INCIDENTS WITH FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

IF SAFE TO DO SO, turn off electrical power at the fuse box before exit.

Shed Supervisor must bring the register outside to account for all present.

DAY SUPERVISOR / FIRE MARSHAL, ENVISIONED FIRE RISKS, EVACUATION AND CHECKS

Fire marshall or supervisor to be vigilent of fires starting at all times of occupation.

Voice announcement to exit immediately if fire detected. Make sure everyone has exited.

Take register and visitor book on exiting to account for everyone.

Follow evacuation procedure on notice board

Always have a mobile phone available able to make an emergency services call

Inform museum staff if Lamp Room is occupied and fire detected.

Ensure exit door and pathways are kept clear for members to exit quickly.

Check smoke alarm at every session.

Beware of sparks form grinders or cutting wheels igniting sawdust.

Ensure members creating sawdust, clear it up as soon as practicable.

Be aware of risks when using flammable cleaning liquids when grinders in use.

Only use fire extinguishing products if safe to do so.

Ensure all electrical equipment turned off at wall sockets when locking up.

Ensure waste products are placed outside or taken to rubbish bins when locking up.

Ensure flammable liquids are stored in the outside metal cabinet.
